

6th Grade World History

The sixth grade Glencoe Human Heritage: A World History curriculum overviews the history of the people and the world around us. The 12 unit text begins by reviewing the five themes of geography. Students will learn about key events, people and ideas that have influenced the development of the world today through information on the prehistoric people all the way through the twentieth century. Students will complete a Greek god or goddess project and other various in-class presentations.

7th Grade Geography

The seventh grade Holt, Rinehart and Winston People, Places, and Changes curriculum includes a detailed overview of the world around us. The 10 unit text first tests students' basic knowledge, skills and understandings of the world around us. Students then begin an in-depth study of each nation of the world, including the culture, climate, landforms, economics and ethnicity of each. Students will complete a multi-part project of a European nation, a poster of an African country, and plan a trip to South America.

8th Grade American History

The eighth grade Holt, Rinehart and Winston Call of Freedom curriculum includes an in-depth study of American History. The 11 unit text will focus on key people, events, and ideas that have shaped the nation, beginning with the first Americans and spanning through present day. Eight graders also complete a detailed study of the Constitution and learn the significance this document has had on our nation now and in the past. We will also thoroughly discuss the Civil War, World War I, and World War II through the preparation of presentations and essays.
